PHILIPPINES DISASTER RELIEF

This week, we witnessed the horrors of another natural disaster: this time a raging storm which struck the Philippines, dubbed Typhoon Haiyan.

The cost in human death-more than 2,300 people at this writing-as well as in dislocation and misery is a pitiful spectacle. The pictures of the devastation are heartbreaking, and we are all affected by the painful knowledge that we are witnessing the sorrow and loss of our fellow human beings.

Our Diocese and its humanitarian aid organization, the Fund for Armenian Relief (FAR), will be contributing to the effort to assist the typhoon victims, working through international relief organizations.

There will be a special plate collection next Sunday, November 24, to support the relief effort in the Philippines

Checks made payable to the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America (please write "Philippines Typhoon Relief" in the memo) will be collected and forwarded to the Diocesan Headquarter.

All proceeds collected will go to the relief efforts.

CATHOLICOS CONDEMNS ATTACKS ON SYRIAN ARMENIANS

Holy Etchmiadzin reported this week that attacks were carried out on the St. Sarkis Armenian Church and the Holy Translators Armenian School in Damascus, Syria. Children were among the victims of the November 11 mortar shelling.

His Holiness Karekin II, the Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, expressed his condolences to the families who lost their loved ones. He condemned the violence against children, and the spate of attacks on Christian neighborhoods.

EVE OF THE FAST OF ADVENT

Today is the Eve (*Paregentan*) of the Fast of Advent (*Hisnag*). This is a week-long fast (Monday to Friday) leading up to the first Sunday of Advent, which is next Sunday, November 25.

Advent is the period that guides us up to the birth and baptism of Christ. It begins fifty days before January 6. Advent is intended to be a solemn and quiet time for prayer, reflection, and meditation in preparation for the mystery of the incarnation.

Traditionally, the entire fifty-day period of Advent has been a period of fasting. Now, there are three week-long fasts during Advent (along with the regular fasting days of Wednesday and Friday). The three week-long fasts are known as: The Fast of Advent (*Hisnagats Bahk*); The Fast of St. James (*Sourp Hagopah Bahk*); and the Fast of the Nativity (*Dznuntyan Bahk*).

THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD TO THE TEMPLE

According to the Holy Tradition of the Church, after turning three, the parents of the Holy Virgin, Jehoiakim and Anna, fulfilling their promise, brought Mary to the temple and presented her to God. Mary remained in the temple until her engagement. One of the feasts dedicated to the Holy Virgin is her presentation to the temple. All Christian Churches celebrate this feast on November 21.

Establishment of the Feast of the Presentation of the Holy Mother of God to the Temple began with King Justinianos' building of a cathedral in honor of the Holy Mother in place of the old Jewish temple on the hill of Moria. The cathedral was consecrated on November 21, 543 AD. After 638 AD, when the cathedral was converted into a mosque, the celebration of the Feast spread throughout the entire Christian world. The Feast has been included in the Armenian Apostolic Church Calendar since the nineteenth century.

LUKE9:44-50

44"Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you: The Son of Man is going to be betrayed into the hands of men." 45But they did not understand what this meant. It was hidden from them, so that they did not grasp it, and they were afraid to ask him about it. 46An argument started among the disciples as to which of them would be the greatest. 47Jesus, knowing their thoughts, took a little child and had him stand beside him. 48Then he said to them, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For he who is least among you all—he is the greatest." 49"Master," said John, "we saw a man driving out demons in your name and we tried to stop him, because he is not one of us." 50"Do not stop him," Jesus said, "for whoever is not against you is for you."
