FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION

The Name of the Feast

The full name of the Feast of Transfiguration is "The Feast of the Brilliant Form of Christ Our God on Mount Tabor." The Armenian term for Transfiguration is *Aylagerbootiun*. The Feast is also called *Vartavar* ("The Feast of Roses").

The Bible and the Feast

The Feast of Transfiguration is the mid-summer celebration of the Theophany—Christ's Revelation on Mount Tabor. The Gospel of the day proclaims, "He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as radiant and shining as the light" (Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 9:2-13; Luke 9:28-36; 2 Peter, 1:16-18).

Origins and History of the Feast

Ancient people came to understand that the sun was at its highest point at a certain time of the year, which they called "mid-summer." It was at mid-summer when the sun was the most brilliant and the rays shone the brightest. The days were the long and warm allowing man to labor longer hours to plant the food that he would collect during the harvest. Thus, in many societies, spirituality and spiritual celebrations were formed to honor mid-summer.

The history of the Feast of the Transfiguration is rooted in the summer solstice feasts of antiquity honoring of such gods and goddesses as Mithra, Zoroaster and Anahid. In the case of Anahid, the goddess of fertility, specifically, it was said that wherever she walked roses grew. Her mid-summer feast was called *Vartavar*—day of roses—and people threw water on one another as a sign of fertility.

The first Armenian Christians in 34 AD saw in Jesus Christ the fulfillment of their spirituality. He was the true "Light of the world" (John 1:12), "By whom the sun shall appear to us from on high to give light to our darkness and to make light dawn upon them that sat in darkness and in the shadow of death and to guide our feet into the ways of peace" (Luke 1:69-79). Thus, "Christ is the true summer Sun" (Matthew 17:2), "Whose brilliant love shines upon us. Jesus is the source of living water which gives eternal life" (John 4:10, 13 and 7:37-39). Saint Gregory the Enlightener, a direct successor the Holy Apostles Thaddeus and Bartholomew, Christianized the celebration of mid-summer by teaching the pagan Armenians to believe in Jesus Christ and to, "Give your roses to Christ and not to the filthy goddess Anahid."

The Meaning of the Feast

The Feast of the Transfiguration is the first great jubilee and *daghavar* (tabernacle) feast of the mystery of Jesus Christ after the Feast of His Marvelous and Wonderful Resurrection and the Feast of the Coming of the Holy Spirit. This Great and Holy Feast contemplates the transformation of Christ on Mount Tabor (Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 2:8; Luke 9:28-36; 2 Pt 1; 16-18) and declares the revelation of the mystery of the eternal glory of Jesus as the divine Son of God. This post-Resurrection feast fulfills the coming of the Holy Spirit and the postponed understanding of Jesus' death, resurrection and glorification (Matthew 17:9 and Mark 9:9) and proclaims and celebrates the glorious transformation of the body and spirit of all the righteous and faithful at the Second Coming of Christ

Today

This Armenian mid-summer feast is a special time for our families to celebrate the grace and blessings of summer—the sun, mountains, water, roses—and of course the brilliant Theophany of the divinity of Christ and the harvest His blessings give us. The great Theophany, for which we prepare to celebrate, will be after our own resurrection at the Second Coming of Jesus Christ who will come in the Glory of the Father.

ARTICLES USED IN THE SANCTUARY

(By Very Rev. Haigazoun Vartabed Melkonian)

HOLY DOVE (AGHAVNEE)

The Holy Dove is used for blessings, confirmations, ordinations and consecrations. It is kept in the left hand niche and is covered by a transparent cloth. It holds the Holy Oil, *Meuron*, which is prepared by the Catholicos and Etchmiadzin approximately once every seven years. The *Meuron* is put in a cauldron and blessed by the Catholicos and other bishops using the holy relics among which are: the right arm of Saint Gregory the Illuminator; those of his two sons Saints Areesdages and Vertanes; the Holy Keghart, the spear that pierced Christ's side. The *Meuron* is then set upon the bema of Holy Etchmiadzin's main altar and remains there for forty days before it is ready to be sent to the various parishes around the world. It is made from forty different fragrant flowers and sweet oils and always some of the previous *Meuron* is added during the blessing.

INCENSE

Sweet-smelling incense is used in the church, usually frankincense. It represents our prayers going up to heaven.

Աղաւնին կը գործածուի օրհնութիւններու, դրոշմներու, ձեռնադրութիւններու եւ օծումներու համար։ Ան կը պահուի ձախակողմեան խորհրդ-անոցին մէջ եւ ծածկուած կ՚ըլլայ թափանցիկ դաստառակով մը։ Աուրբ Միւռոնը, որ կը պատրաստուի կաթողիկոսին կողմէ Սուրբ Էջմիածնի մէջ մօտաւորապէս եօթը տարին անգամ մը, կը դրուի աղաւնիին մէջ։

Միւռոնը կը դրուի կաթսային մէջ կ'օրհնուի կաթողիկոսին եւ ներկայ եպիսկոպոսներու կողմէ, որոնք կը գործածեն Սուրբ մասունքները, որոնց մէջ են. Սուրբ Գրիգոր Լուսաւորիչի Աջը, իր երկու որդիներուն՝ Արիստակէսի եի Վրթանէսի. եւ Սուրբ Գեղարդը - այն նիզակը որով Քրիստոսի կողը խոցեցին։ Ապա կաթսան կը դրուի Սուրբ Էջմիածնի աւագ խորանի բեմին վրայ եւ հոն կը մնայ քառասուն օր, նախքան սփիւոքի առաջնորդարաններուն բաժնուիլը։ Ան կը պատրաստուի քառասուն տեսակ անուշաբոյր ծաղիկներէ եւ իւղերէ, որոնց նախկին Միւռոնէն մաս մը միշտ կը խառնեն։

ԽበՒՆԿ

Անուշաբոյր խունկը (կնդրուկ) կը գործածուի եկեղեցիի ներսը ընդհանրապէս։ Ան կը խորհրդանշէ մեր աղօթքներուն դէպի երկինք բարձրանալը։

SCRIPTURE READINGS

MATTHEW 16:13-17:13

13Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He was asking His disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" 14And they said, "Some say John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; but still others, Jeremiah, or one of the prophets." 15He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" 16Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." 17And Jesus said to him, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, because flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. 18"I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. 19"I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind on earth shall have been bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall have been loosed in heaven." 20Then He warned the disciples that they should tell no one that He was the Christ.

21From that time Jesus began to show His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes,

and be killed, and be raised up on the third day. 22Peter took Him aside and began to rebuke Him, saying, "God forbid it, Lord! This shall never happen to You." 23But He turned and said to Peter, "Get behind Me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to Me; for you are not setting your mind on God's interests, but man's "

24Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me. 25"For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it; but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it. 26"For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul? 27"For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and will then repay every man according to his needs.

28 "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who will not taste death until they see the Son of Man coming in His kingdom."

17After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. 2There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. 3Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus.

4Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

5While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!"

6When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. **7**But Jesus came and touched them. "Get up," he said. "Don't be afraid." **8**When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

9As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus instructed them, "Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead." **10**The disciples asked him, "Why then do the teachers of the law say that Elijah must come first?"

11 Jesus replied, "To be sure, Elijah comes and will restore all things. 12 But I tell you, Elijah has already come, and they did not recognize him, but have done to him everything they wished. In the same way the Son of Man is going to suffer at their hands." 13 Then the disciples understood that he was talking to them about John the Baptist.
