Did You Know That...

The *Badarak*, not counting the priest's prayers, is about 4,700 words long but has only 1,400 different roots, of which 200 constitute approximately 80% of the text. Et (*Yev* (and) is the most common word; it occurs 438 times and constitutes nearly 10% of the text. This means that if you knew only the word Et, you'd already understand 1 out of every 10 words of the Mass. Moreover, if you knew 199 other words and their variants, you would understand 8 out of every 10 words in the Mass.

Over the next few months, each week you can learn 2 of the 50 most commonly used words in the *Badarak* in our parish bulletin:
