
NEW YEAR



Presently all Christian denominations celebrate New Year on January 1. The word "January" means "birth." Before Christ's coming to the world, mankind was the captive of hell and was constrained by eternal death. Being born in January, Christ destroyed hell and saved mankind from eternal death and led it to the Kingdom of Heaven. That is why January became the first month

of the year. Thus January 1 is the first day of the first month of the year and symbolizes the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

It is a folk tradition that on January 1 people decorate the New Year tree, which symbolizes the Tree of Life in the Garden of Eden.



BLESSING OF POMEGRANATESThe Mysterious Gift

"The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good" (Gen 1:12).

Throughout the centuries, the pomegranate has been weaved into Armenian architecture, cuisine, art, manuscripts, literature, liturgical vestments and accessories. For the first time in history in 2015, the Supreme Patriarch of the Armenian Church, His Holiness Karekin II, Catholicos of all Armenians, together with the Armenian faithful, introduced a new service for the Blessing of Pomegranates, one of the seven biblical species of fruits and grains, at the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin.

Christians have seen in the pomegranate an image of the Church: the seeds may be separated by a membrane, but they are undivided. The seeds are in communion, just like us, the faithful of the Church, acting as one body without losing our individuality in the Church; through the blood of Christ, we become greater than the sum of our parts! The striking red color of the fruit reminds us of Christ's blood and suffering, and the calyx (head) of the pomegranate represents Christ's crown as the King of kings.

For the various cultures of the Mediterranean region, the fruit represents life, fertility, and abundance. The pomegranate has numerous health benefits due to its high antioxidant content, and is the subject of research for its effects on

cancer, cardiovascular disease, and diabetes among other conditions. Long before science revealed the healing powers of the pomegranate, the Christian Armenians have associated this biblical fruit with the mystery of the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ.

This mysterious, life giving, and delicious fruit needs to be unwrapped like a gift to reveal its beauty and nutrition. This miraculous and sacred fruit reminds us of the message of the Gospel. When the plain shell of the pomegranate is burst, we see the gems that it contains; similarly, one needs to dig deeply into the Christian faith to uncover its sweet treasures. At the core of that Christian teaching is the figure of Jesus, who in every way was an ordinary mortal human, yet revealed himself to be the incarnate Creator and Savior of the universe.

As we welcome the new year, may each of us reveal like pomegranates the sweet treasure of goodness planted in us by our Lord. May the new year be fruitful and abundantly filled with God's unconditional love.

HOME BLESSING

One of the traditions of the Armenian Apostolic Church is the Home Blessing Service, which, according to St. Gregory of Datev, was established by Our Savior Jesus Christ when after his Resurrection He entered the upper room and blessed his disciples. When it was evening of that blessed day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you" (John. 20:19). Following his example, Christ's chosen twelve visited the homes of the faithful to bless them and to spread the good news of Christ's Birth and Resurrection.

In keeping with the Apostles' practice, according to the sacred traditions of the Armenian Apostolic Church, clergy are to visit the homes of the faithful on the occasions of Christmas (Theophany) and Easter (Holy Resurrection) to tell of the good news of Our Lord's Nativity and Resurrection and to bless them and their homes through the Home Blessing Service. Home blessings are also encouraged on the joyous occasion of moving into a new home.

Through the Home Blessing Service, the house of the faithful becomes a small church. "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:2). During the Service, the priest prays to God and asks Him to keep the home and its inhabitants, especially the children of the family, in good health so that they may live a devout life glorifying the name of Almighty God and strengthening His Holy Church. Furthermore, the priest prays for love and peace, which our church forefathers understood so long ago to be the cornerstones of any family, to prevail in the newly sanctified home.

It is important, however, that the faithful be mindful of the Heavenly Graces that fill their homes and thus be worthy of God's love and peace. For if sinful behavior dominates in the house, it can never become a true church inhabited by the Holy Trinity and the saints and angels. Sacredness and peace are disturbed by sinful behavior, and there can be no peace or understanding of sacredness, love, unity and harmony in such a house. God's blessings can never be given under such circumstances. And any space that is devoid of the Lord's protection will naturally be full of evils and devils and, as Scripture tells us, will be a space where, "Like a roaring lion your adversary the devil prowls around, looking for someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8).

To be sure, priestly prayers and blessings alone are not enough to renew our spiritual life and to remove evil from our homes. Great faith is needed from each individual in order to receive blessing and healing as well as to commune with the Divine Graces. As we read in the Gospel of Matthew, "Then he touched their eyes and said, 'According to your faith let it be done to you'" (Matthew 9:29). Thus, each family member should prepare themselves for the Home Blessing Service through faithful prayer, repentance and fasting because, "This kind does not come out except by prayer and fasting" (Matthew 17:20).

All parishioners who wish to have their homes blessed on the occasion of the Feast of the Theophany and Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ should call Der Hovhan (847) 644-7389 to make arrangements. Please have a piece of bread, a dish of salt and a glass of water available for the blessing.

Christmas Yughakin. In this Holy Season of Christmas it has become a tradition in our church to donate our Christmas Yughakins as a gift of love in memory or in honor of our loved ones. The Yughakin form and the enclosed Offering Envelope are for your convenience.

Yughakin tradition is an ancient custom, which goes back to the Old Testament times. The faithful would bring oil to the temple of God so that its servants would have enough to eat. Later on this custom entered into the Christian religion when oil was brought to Church by believers in order to illuminate it by lighting the lamps in the Church.

Today, Yughakin is simply the price or the value of oil donated to the Church. Yughakin in Armenian means "price of oil." In our church, today, we of course do not burn oil in order to illuminate the sanctuary, but we use electricity, gas and other operating expenses. Let us continue the custom of Yughakin to keep the lights of St. James always burning!
