FASTING FOR HOLY COMMUNION

The Holy Communion is one of the important sacraments for the salvation of Christians and for the nourishment of our souls. Holy Communion is a sacrament by which the believer receives Christ's Body and Blood in the form of bread and wine for remission of sins and the reception of eternal life. It is offered to the faithful during the celebration of Badarak. For person in good health, it is necessary to fast, abstain from food and participate in the sacrament of Confession before receiving Holy Communion. For those of ill health who are on special medication, a light breakfast is permitted. Fir the evening Badarak, fasting should begin after the midday meal and continue until the evening Badarak has been celebrated.

MAS

MAS (Antidoron) is very thin unleavened bread of wheat, of any reasonable size making it possible to be baked on a metal tray. It can be made by any member of the congregation. It is distributed after the Liturgy to those of the congregation who have not received communion. It is customary to take mas to the members of one's family and to friends, who have been unable to attend the Liturgy. *Mas* symbolizes the bond of love among the members of the church.

Mas, meaning "a portion", represents the remaining part if the loaf which the faithful used to bring to Church in ancient times to be used as bread for the Eucharist. A fraction (*nshkhar*) of this loaf was taken to consecration, while the remainder was distributed among the congregation at the end of the Liturgy.

ՄԵՌԵԼՈՑ – MERELOTZ - DAY OF REMEMBRANCE

It is a solemn tradition that on the day following the 5 major feast days of the Armenian Church, a day is observed in memory of those who have passed away, and are asleep in Jesus Christ. On this day, the faithful will visit the grave sides of their dearly departed, and the priest will offer requiem prayers for their souls. According to tradition, a special Divine Liturgy is also held on these days, when the faithful can remember the names of all of the faithful for whom we pray for eternal life. These Divine Liturgies are not typically celebrated in the Diaspora, because of people's work schedules, but the faithful are invited to offer the names of the faithful to be prayed for during the Divine Liturgy celebrated the following Sunday.

If you would like to observe this tradition on the Sunday following a major feast day, which includes Christmas, Easter, Feast of the Transfiguration, Assumption of the Holy Virgin Mary, and the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, please contact the Church Office or Der Hovhan.

FEASTS AND FASTS

EVE OF THE FAST OF THE HOLY CROSS OF VARAK

This is the Sunday preceding the week prior to the feast of the Appearance of the Holy Cross on the Mount Varak, lasting from Monday to Friday. Being hidden by St. Hripisime on the Mount Varak, the relic of the Lord's Wooden Cross was found by a miracle in the 7th century and the Armenian Apostolic Church established another purely national feast dedicated to the Holy Cross, which is famous as the Holy Cross of Varak.

NAME DAY CELEBRATIONS

Whenever you know a friend or loved one whose Name Day/Feast Day is soon to be celebrated, honor the person by presenting them with a lit candle saying, "Anoonovut abrees" or "Anoonovut dzeranas" ("May you grow old with your name"). Or you can simply say, "Happy Name Day!"

NAME DAY celebrated this week: Simeon (September 21), Peprone, Mariane, Shoushan (September 22), Baragham, Antimos, Yeranos (September 24), Gevorg, George, Kevork, Adoktos, Romanos (September 26).

COMMEMORATION OF ST. GEVORG THE CAPTAIN

St. Gevorg the Captain (St. George the Warrior) was from Cappadocia. He was born in a pious Christian family. Becoming a soldier of the Roman Army in a short period he deserves the honor of becoming Captain thanks to his courage and devotion. During the council convened by the Roman Emperor Dioklethianos he opposes to his plans on Christians' execution, and thus the fact that he is Christian, is revealed. The King, becoming surprised and astonished, orders to imprison the Captain and subjects him to severe torments. Many people, among them the Queen Alexandria, become Christians thanks to the preaching of St. George. A magician is ordered to prepare two kinds of remedies for trying the saint and changing his faith. By the first cup the saint should change his mind, and drinking the second cup, he should die. St. Gevorg drinks both cups, but thanks to the power of his faith towards God he remains alive. He also raises a man from the dead.

After the King's repeated requests St. Gevorg finally agrees to offer sacrifice to the idols. However, reaching the heathen church he breaks all idols one by one. For this act the King orders to behead St. Gevorg and he is martyred in about 303 A. D.

ST. SHOUSHAN, DAUGHTER OF VARTAN THE GREAT

St. Shoushan (470 AD), whose baptismal name was Varteni, was the daughter of St. Vartan. She was married to Vazken, the son of the Georgian King, to whom he bore three sons and one daughter. Vazken, after being called to Persia, returned to Georgia, having renounced his faith and brought with him another wife. St. Shoushan was appalled by what he had done and sought sanctuary in the church. Vazken was determined that she should change her faith. He insulted her father's memory and had her chained in prison, where she was subjected to more than seven years to all kinds of torture. He forced her children to apostatize (renounce a religious belief). After her death, it took the pleas of the high-ranking clergy as well as the king's brother and other relatives to have her buried properly. The king's wish was to have her dismembered and her memory erased for all time.

ST. SIMEON THE STYLITE

Son of a poor shepherd, and worked as a shepherd as a child. A would-be monk at age 13, he was turned away from monasteries because of his severe selfimposed penance. Tired of the gossip and arguments from fellow religious, he lived as a hermit on top of a column, occasionally preaching to those who gathered to watch and pray with him, and starting a movement of pillar living among Eastern hermits. Born c. 390 at Cilicia, near Syria,. Died c 459 of natural causes.

ST. ROMANOS THE MELODIST

St. Romanos was one of the greatest and most original of the early church hymnographers, and is referred to by some as "the greatest Christian poet". Very little is known of his life. He was born in Emesa (modern Homs), Syria, probably of Jewish parents (although this s not certain). From Homs he went to Beryte (modern Beirut), where he was deacon in the Church of the Resurrection. He then became a priest in Constantinople, where he received the gift of poetry in the church of the Theotokos (Kyros). He died circa 540-550 AD in the New Rome (Constantinople), and was buried in the church of Kyros. Nothing else is known of his history.

St. Romanos introduced hymnography into the Eastern Liturgy, which was of Syro-Palestinian origin. Before him, there were only a few poetical church compositions in Syria, such as, "O Gladdening Light" and "Glory to God in the Highest." St. Romanos wrote a classical form of hymn with a long and elaborate metrical dramatic homily which usually paraphrases a Biblical narrative. He is credited with writing many beautiful hymns that have had an impact on Armenian hymnology.

STEEPLE REPAIR PROJECT

Dear Parishioners,

The building has stood as a testament to God since 1896 and has deteriorated to the point that urgent repairs are required. The brick facade of the steeple is separating from the wall; the mortar has crumbled and the windows are leaking into the vestibule of the hurch. Significant work is required to restore the structural integrity of the front of the building within and under the steeple.

These repairs need to be under way as soon as possible. Our community has always been protected by the shadow of the Holy Church. This is OUR opportunity to meet the church in her moment of need as she has been there for every one of our life events.

STAINED GLASS WINDOW RESTORATION PROJECT

St. James Armenian Church is in the process of restoring all the stained glass windows due to various issues; including individual stained glass pieces falling out, rotted exterior window wood, and glass pieces that are broken or were previously replaced with mismatched pieces. These windows are original to the church.

The Parish Council and Building Committee chose Arttig, LTD to be the contractor for this project. Arttig, LTD has completed other projects in the Armenian community including designing and constructing church stained glass windows and wood carved front doors.

We encourage as many parishioners as possible to participate, at any level your family wishes, so that you, your family and the entire parish can share in the legacy of this historic project.

We welcome as many families and parishioners as possible to donate towards two altar windows, which have the highest restoration costs.
