I didn't realize how much I missed it all.

I had a similar, even deeper, experience 30 years ago after Meg and I travelled through Europe, visiting the great Armenian Churches there. In Paris, with its powerful choir in the balcony, London, Amsterdam, Moscow. Then during our year in Armenia, hearing the all male choir at St. Gayane, seeing the ancient churches, and of course Holy Etchmiadzin. We even returned through Jerusalem and had a week in the historic Armenian Quarter.

Back then I also had been absent from our St. James for about 18 months. When we innocently shuffled in, the familiar beauty of our own fine choir sent tears running down my cheeks. I think at that time it was led by Mr. Vart, but Jirair K. was certainly there, as well as the other singers from my parents' generation and a few younger ones.
